• 2019/20 Precept: Councillors reviewed forecast for 2019/20. Mowing costs remain the same for			
19/20, but there are some increases in expenditure and additional items, including election costs and			
audit fees. It was noted that forecasted costs for the following year were also expect to increase. An			
indication of Precept levels for neighbouring parishes was provided by WBC and showed that			
Brightwalton was in line with its neighbouring Councils. Councillors agreed that it was important that			
the precept meets the day to day expenditure of the Parish Council so that Reserves can be kept for			
projects. For the coming year this required an increase of 3%. Precept agreed at £6,695, S Youldon to			
submit request to WBC.			
Questions from Parishioners			
• Land behind Butts Furlong: It has been reported that there is an increase in items being left behind			
several of the houses on Butts Furlong. Initial letter to be sent to residents requesting that this			
removed. S Youldon to draft, S Orpen & T Wyatt to review.			
• Creation of Off Road School Parking: As agreed the PC contacted Thames Water requesting an area			
of its land to create off road parking for the school. Thames Water responded that the land could not			
be used as it contains large underground pipework and is required for ongoing access of vehicles and			
lifting equipment.			
Any Other Business			
• Elections: Councillors were reminded that the Parish / Town Elections take place on the 2 nd May.			
Notice of elections will be published on the 15 th March which starts the nomination process. All			
Councillors wishing to stand again need to complete and submit applications by the 3 rd April.			
• Polling Stations: Consultation document received from WBC regarding Polling Stations, no changes			
for Brightwalton, no comment to be made.			
• Water Leak: It was noted that there is a significant water leak on Holt Lane near the turning to			
Pudding Lane. Water is currently running down the road, S Youldon to check this has already been			
reported and is being treated as urgent. Concern raised that should this freeze it would be extremely			
hazardous.			
• Road Signs: It was noted that a number of road signs around the Parish need re-securing. S Youldon			
to put together a list and submit to highways.
